Packing

We suggest you bring:

- A laptop/tablet/smartphone – the school has WiFi.
- An Insurance Card – if you have medical health travel insurance, bring proof.
- Warm clothes for all seasons (even if you are here in the summer!) – warm coat, waterproof shoes, a scarf, gloves, a hat and an umbrella as well as a few warm indoor clothes – you may find our houses here are not as warm as in your country.
- Sports gear – clean sports clothes & shoes. The school arranges different sports, there are many places in Wimbledon with a range of sports facilities.
- A rucksack or a bag – to carry your books to school.
- Adaptor – standard voltage in the UK is 240 volts with type G plugs in use.
- Medicine – if you need medication, bring it with you as it's not always easy to find the equivalent to your prescription.
- **Passport – very IMPORTANT. You need to bring your passport to school on your first day.**
- Please also scan or make a copy of this (and your visa if you have one), and any other important documents you need to bring with you (driving licence, etc.). Bring the photocopies with you and then leave them in a safe place at home in case you lose the originals.

Heathrow → Wimbledon

Public Transport:

From the Arrivals Hall, follow the UNDERGROUND sign. Take the Piccadilly Line (navy blue) to EARLS COURT. At Earls Court change to the District Line (green) for WIMBLEDON (usually platforms 3 or 4). NB. Not all District Line trains go to Wimbledon. Check the sign at the front of the train. From Wimbledon Station take a taxi to your host family.

You can find black taxis outside the station – please check how much your journey might be before getting inside. For more information on travelling to and from Heathrow airport, please visit:

Stansted → Wimbledon

Public Transport:

Take the Overground train to TOTTENHAM HALE. At Tottenham Hale take the Underground Victoria Line (light blue) to VAUXHALL. At Vauxhall take the Overground train (platform 8) to WIMBLEDON. You can buy a direct ticket from Stansted to Wimbledon. From Wimbledon station take a taxi to your host family – please check how much your journey might be before getting into the taxi. You can also take Stansted Coach service. For more information on travelling to and from Stansted airport, visit:

Luton → Wimbledon

Public Transport:

Take the 'First Capital Connect' train from Luton Airport Parkway to Wimbledon. Check the trains – some trains are direct, for others you may need to change. The journey time is approx. 1.5 hours. Check

www.thetrainline.com for ticket prices and train times. From Wimbledon station take a taxi to your host family. Please check how much your journey might be before getting in to the taxi. London City Airport → Wimbledon

Public Transport:

From the Arrivals Hall take the Docklands Light Railway / DLR (turquoise) to CANNING TOWN. Take the Jubilee Line (grey) to WATERLOO. At Waterloo take the Overground train to WIMBLEDON, normally from platforms 1 – 5. From Wimbledon station take a taxi to your host family. Please check how much your journey might be before getting into the taxi. For information on traveling to and from London airport, visit www.londoncityairport.com/getting-to-and-from

St Pancras International → Wimbledon

Public Transport:

There are 2 options:

- Option 1: Take the Underground Victoria Line (light blue) to VAUXHALL. At Vauxhall take the Overground train (platform 8) to WIMBLEDON.
- Option 2: Take the 'First Capital Connect' direct train from St Pancras to WIMBLEDON. There is a direct train every 30 minutes. The journey time is approximately 40 minutes. From Wimbledon station take a taxi to your host family. Please check how much your journey might be before getting into the taxi.

Gatwick → Wimbledon

Public Transport:

From the Arrivals Hall, follow the TRAIN sign. Take a train to CLAPHAM JUNCTION. Change at CLAPHAM JUNCTION for a train to WIMBLEDON (usually platform 11). All trains leaving platform 11 stop at Wimbledon. Alternatively, take the train to East Croydon and change to the tram. From Wimbledon Station take a taxi to your host family; Please check with the driver how much your journey might cost before you board.

Taxi: You can take a taxi from Gatwick direct to your host family. From the Arrivals Hall follow the GATWICKCARS sign. Please check how much your journey might be before getting in to the taxi. For more information on travelling to and from Gatwick airport, please visit:
